Mayor Bill's Message

On January 5, 2016 I presented to the City Council a "State of the City" report that included information comparing the cost of government with neighboring cities. This report can be seen online at RivertonCity.Com. This month, and in the next few months, I will share some highlights from that report.



In comparing full time equivalent (FTE) and salary cost per resident between Riverton and the four contiguous cities of Bluffdale, Draper, Herriman, and South Jordan, the number of city employees and the cost of employees was lower in Riverton City. I believe the reason we have the lowest FTE and salary cost in the comparison is because of the principles we use in providing City services, and hiring employees.

Riverton City's principles for providing City services:

- Provide the best City services for the most reasonable cost
- Decide if a City service is best provided by...
 - A City employee
 - Contracting with another government entity
 - Contracting with a private company

Riverton City's principles for hiring a City employee:

- Hire the best employee we can and pay competitive salaries to attract and keep top talent.

Hiring top-tier key employees can save the City money. Two examples of the many highly effective employees we have now include our Administrative Services Director and Public Works Director. Our Administrative Services Director serves as our Finance Director and Human Resources Director. Previously there were two employees providing these functions. Our Public Works Director also functions as the City Engineer. Previously these positions were filled by two employees. The Public Works Director has also brought Design Services, Project Management, and Property Acquisition in-house. These functions had been previously performed by consulting engineers. This has increased performance and responsiveness and more importantly saved a significant amount of money over the past eight years. Our Public Works Director also has the skillset to apply for and receive federal, state and county grants to build our City roads. We have received millions of dollars in grants that the City had never received before.

Since Riverton hired its first employee, the City has improved the quality of services with great employees. When I moved here in 1975 the City had an employee named Peggy Green. Peggy helped me in many ways to set up my City services as a new resident, and schedule inspections on my home. She helped to make my move to Riverton easier on me and my family. Today we have great employees, too. I am very proud of the help Riverton City employees provide to our residents. As the City continues to grow, so will our level of service and commitment to making Riverton a great community in which to live.

Winter Parking Restrictions

A Reminder for Riverton City Residents:

NO PARKING ON THE ROADWAY DURING THE HOURS OF MIDNIGHT TO 7 A.M. BEGINNING NOVEMBER 1, 2015, TO APRIL 1, 2016

To report unsafe, snowy conditions, such as ice or wind-drift call (801) 208-3162 during regular business hours or (801) 254-0704 after business hours.

Riverton City's Limited Winter Parking Ordinance #11-3-45:

It shall be unlawful for any person or owner of any vehicle to park a motor vehicle, travel trailer, horse trailer, utility trailer or other like vehicle on any street in this municipality between the 1st day of November of each year and the first day of April of the following year, for a period of time longer than three minutes when loading or unloading passengers and for a period of time longer than thirty minutes when loading, unloading or delivering property between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. on the streets of Riverton City.

Violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by citation or impounding and removal of the vehicle.



Time to Shut Off Your Secondary Water Valve

All of the lines are drained and it's now time to turn your secondary water valves in the closed position. Your secondary water valves are located in the green box in your front yard. If you do not turn off your secondary ball valve, you may experience flooding or other problems when the Water Department starts filling the secondary system in the spring. The City is not liable for any problems that may occur from winterization techniques in private sprinkler systems. Users are

responsible for any damage due to water entering their systems during both the on and off seasons.

If Water Department Staff has to respond to your home to shut off your ball valve in your secondary green box, you will be assessed a \$60 fee. Water Department employees still see many homes with hoses attached to the culinary and secondary hose bibs. We suggest you disconnect them to keep them from freezing. Also, be sure the lid on your culinary water meter is closed down tight to prevent freezing.
